How did you handle the winds?

Power loss, trees down and bad hair days are part of Spring!

As is normal for this time of year, the competition between Winter and Spring is felt in the heavy winds. Gusts of around 110kph (68 mph) were recorded throughout the Shire. Unsurprisingly, power went down in many parts of NSW. Fortunately only about half of Wingello was without power.

Do you have a plan for WHEN the power goes? We live in a lovely part of the world with lots of trees. Trees grow and age and can fall or drop branches, especially in heavy winds. Going for a walk during these winds is definitely not recommended!

Going without power in Wingello means not only no electricity, but also no water, as we need pumps to get the water from our storage tanks.

Seasoned locals have generators on standby. Of course it is a good idea to periodically check your generator or they will certainly fail when you need them!

Some homes have generators built in to the power either automatically or via a switch. Those that are able to generate enough solar power to make a battery worthwhile can utilise the battery power for a while.

Endeavour Energy did an amazing job with crews working non stop to bring power back up across the Shire and other areas of NSW.


Meanwhile reports of trees across roads came in and within a short time either locals or the Fire Brigade were able to clear the way.

2024 Council Elections

After a few years under Administration, we once more are required to vote for a new selection of 9 councillors.

There are 60 candidates grouped into 9 groups A though I.

Voting will be at the

Wingello Mechanics Institute Hall on Saturday 14 September from 8am to 6pm.

It is important you take the short time required to cast your vote. Do some research into each candidate's positions and ask your fellow villagers if they know anything about the candidates. Then decide who would work best to represent you, your village and the Shire's interests the best.

The Council is a large business with many staff, a large financial budget and many competing responsibilities. The councillors will be there for at least four years so consider who would do best working with the other councillors and could represent you and the Shire the best.

How do I vote?

Above the Line (by group)

This means you enter at least a 1 in one of the group boxes. Your votes go to those candidates in the order on the ballot form.

You can also add more preferences for the other groups if you wish.

Below the Line (by individual)

As there are 9 candidates, so you need to select at least 5 candidates, entering 1 through 5 as needed.

How do votes get counted?

There is a quota worked out based on the number of votes cast divided by the number of positions available. Any candidate getting that quota gets in. Any leftover votes are allocated based on each ballot's 2nd choice.
