The changed Wingello State Forest

Almost five years on and the forest is bare

On 4 January 2020 bush fire ripped through the heart of the Wingello State Forest after the fires crossed the Shoalhaven Gorge, before attacking our village of Wingello.

Most of the visible reminders of the day have been cleaned up in Wingello, with a number of new homes replacing those that were destroyed and most of the blackened and dead trees removed.

I would recommend locals going for a short drive down Forest Road and going into the State "Forest" to the camping grounds.

The area is transformed from a very well covered area to a very dry wasteland - described by some as a "moon-scape".

The clever people working on the mountain bike tracks are only able to work on a much smaller section of the old famous single track system. The old system was devastated by the fires with all the bridges burnt out. Much of the old area is closed as unstable dangerous trees remain and the fire also destroyed the root system, meaning the soil has no stability and has trouble absorbing moisture. This makes regrowth difficult and the ground treacherous.

We should soon start seeing Mountain Bikers back on the newly rebuilt track system, but the old areas won't be able to be accessed for at least 10 years according to those that have been able to assess the area.

This is all a good reminder to remember the goods things we have and plan to be prepared. All areas have their own risks that go with the beauty and charm of where we live. Whether it is city or country, mountain or sea, forest or plains, we all need to understand where we live and make appropriate precautions. We cannot be risk free, but we can be prepared and enjoy the beauty and benefits of the areas





in which we live.




Local Natural Beauty
